Spring Cleaning – Help out in Front of Your Property

There are a lot of needles in the street gutters from residents' trees. It would be very helpful if every resident could just clean up what is in front of their property. This would ensure proper drainage as well as prevent damage to the adjoining asphalt. Thank you.



Trash and Bears

Some residents are placing their trash cans out before trash day. Please remember to only put trash

cans out in the morning of your trash pick-up day. Putting cans out before that attract bears and we do not want them to start frequenting our neighborhood. La Plata County has an

ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. Residents must leave their trash containers in a garage until the day of pick-up and put the container back inside by the end of the day; or have a bear-proof garbage container. You can report trash can raids by bears to County Dispatch at 385-2900. Check out bearsmartdurango.org for more resources.

Wildfire Mitigation Projects Completed

The District has completed its major Wildfire Mitigation projects. Our contractor performed mitigation on the Interior Greenbelt that extends from Oak Drive to Willow Drive as well as the small triangle between Willow Drive and Fir Drive and the one in between Oak Drive and Michael Way. As he came in under budget, he was able to get a head start on maintenance work in the canyon as well.

In the three years of wildfire mitigation work, the District spent \$104,000 and mitigated over 64 acres of district property. Please see map below for mitigation areas – green is 2018; blue is 2020; yellow is 2021. The district will continue to budget for mitigation maintenance work in future years; but it is great to have completed this essential major project!

Wildfire Mitigation for Property Owners – Home Ignition Zone



Homeowners are advised to clean up the needles from roofs and gutters as well as assess mitigation needs on their own properties. Adapted Wildfire Partnership have many mitigation resources available for homeowners. DW2 residents are eligible for programs that Adapted Wildfire Partnership offers. Open Burning Prohibition Reminder

With spring clean-up under way, please be careful with needles and slash piles. A reminder that there is a district prohibition on open burning. Building, main-

taining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, stove fire, burn barrel or trash fire within the boundaries of the Durango West Metropolitan District No. 2 is prohibited. The prohibition on open burning does not apply to (i) grilling or cooking food using charcoal, wood, propane or natural gas in appliances designed for cooking or grilling; or (ii) patio wood or gas-burning units such as a chiminea, patio warmer, or other wood or gas-burning device used for outdoor recreation and/or heating. Residents need to comply with any stricter prohibitions is-

sued by La Plata County or the Fire Department. Building, maintaining, attending, or using any fire within the open space and greenbelt areas of Durango West Metropolitan District No. 2 is prohibited without exception. Drought Update

Parts of La Plata County are in extreme drought and



other parts are rated as in exceptional drought. The last 11 months (April 2020 to Feb 2021) are the driest on record for Colorado as a whole (when compared to the same 11 months for the period of record). The dryness will reduce springtime runoff, especially in western Colorado. Above normal tempera-

tures and below average precipitation are anticipated in the upcoming months. Extreme soil moisture deficits and below normal precipitation means all basins should prepare for a low runoff year. The continuance of drought is expected through 2021. (from Colorado Water Conservation Board's Joint Water Availability & Flood Task Force)

Water Conservation

The District advises residents that we are not only in an extreme drought year but are also at the same time experiencing prolonged drought years. Therefore, please remember to practice conservation measures as water is a precious resource. Also remember this when making decisions regarding landscaping or plants and choose xeric-landscaping options when practical. Here is one resource: http://coloradowaterwise.org/XeriscapeColorado.

DW2 Water Situation

Some of our water comes from our wells within DW2, and some of our water comes from Lake Durango Water Authority (LDWA). Our wells are currently not producing so we are depending on LDWA this year until monsoons hopefully kick in. LDWA purchases water from Lake Nighthorse then sells that water to DW2, among other districts and retail customers. While this means that DW2 has a more consistent water supply through LDWA, it comes at a cost and is not an unlimited supply. LDWA contracts with Lake Nighthorse to purchase a set number of acre feet each year in addition to its other water rights. DW2 pays a flat rate to access LDWA water. Our acquisition and monthly bulk service fees are \$8,519 every month. Additionally, we are charged for all water used according to a tiered rate structure. Despite implementing a new rate structure in January 2020 and 2020 being a very dry year, we still had very high water use during the 2020 spring and summer months, resulting in much higher water costs for the district. More crucially, it resulted in a few precarious times when the water tank level was below the amount required for fire protection. We are asking those that already practice water conservation to continue doing so this year. For those high-water users, the District asks you to please cut back on your water usage this year. For those in the middle, continue to watch what you use and cut back when you can. Otherwise, the District may need to institute more stringent water conservation methods and penalties like we have had to do in the past.



Mosquito Control

DW2 has contracted with Animas Mosquito Control District to put environmentally friendly briquettes around district ponds to prevent mosquitos. However, since the water is low this year in the pond and our minnows are

plentiful (they eat the mosquito eggs and larvae), they are not currently finding larvae. They will continue to monitor the situation.

Eliminate Mosquito Breeding Grounds

Please do your part in eliminating breeding grounds for mosquitoes by checking for standing water around your homes and getting rid of it. This small effort will help protect yourself, your family and your neighbors from mosquito-borne diseases. Mosquitoes breed in standing water. A couple of times a week you should drain any areas where water sits – including flower pots and bird baths, pet bowls, gutters and construction materials.

Trails and Greenbelt

Residents should not push or deposit needles or other yard waste on any trails or district greenbelt. We have received reports of individuals doing this in the past. While those doing this may have good intentions, depositing any materials on the trails is prohibited. It can be a fire danger as well as a hindrance or danger for bikers, etc. Thank you for your cooperation.

No Parking on Streets



DO NOT park vehicles or trailers on subdivision streets anytime. It is a safety hazard in our neighborhood since we have no sidewalks. It also greatly hinders fire and emergency vehicles and snowplowing efforts. Parking on District streets is prohibited under Resolution 2004-03.

Be a Good Neighbor - Clean Up after Your Dog



With the snows now gone, residents are noticing dog poop and dog poop bags around the neighborhood. Please be respectful of district property and residents' yards by always picking poop up after your dog(s) as well as your poop bags when you are on District roads, trails, greenbelts, and residents' yards and disposing

of properly. This helps to ensure that everyone can fully enjoy our subdivision.
