Vandalism Costs Everyone

There have been several recent vandalism attacks on district property. These cost the district money and resources that now will not be available to spend on other projects or needed repairs around the neighborhood. We have a small budget for maintenance and improvements to the common areas. These acts of vandalism included:

• Ssomeone rolled our bench into the pond last fall. It was heavy, we had to pull it out with a truck and a pulley and could not get it pulled out until this spring. Someone just pushed it back down the hill into the pond and now the concrete part is unfixable.

• Graffiti was painted last month on both sides of ball wall as well as on the basketball court.

• Last year, the community AED was strewn on a neighbors lawn;

• A glass window was broken at the mail building;

• The community bulletin case acrylic window was broken. It not only needed replacing but has led to problems with closing the bulletin board properly which renders it not very useful. If you see someone, take a photo. Report to police if you can. Email any information to the district. Talk to the people in your household about vandalism and its toll on our neighborhood. As residents, we all pay for these actions. They not only cost the district to repair but also take precious resources away from providing other amenities and badly needed maintenance.

Road Projects 2020 Begin June 8

This year's road projects will begin June 8th. They include: crack-filling and weed spraying curb-line around the subdivision; repair and sealcoat upper portion of Cedar Drive, Elm Court, and Willow Court as well as pave the emergency exit at the top of Aspen Drive. Please do not park on the street as this greatly hinders their work.



Stage 1 Fire Restrictions

At the request of local fire chiefs, La Plata County commissioners unanimously enacted Stage 1 fire restrictions on May 12th in the unincorporated areas of the county, as well as lands owned by La Plata County. The restrictions include: A

ban on open burns, burn barrels and agricultural burning.

Eliminate Mosquito Breeding Grounds

The District has contracted with Animas Mosquito Control District to treat the pond areas for mosquito larvae. Please do your part in eliminating breeding grounds

for mosquitoes by checking for standing water around your homes and getting rid of it. This small effort will help protect yourself, your family, and your neighbors from mosquito-borne diseases.

Mosquitoes breed in standing water as small as a bottle cap. So the EPA recommends:

• Eliminate standing water in rain gutters, old tires, buckets, plastic covers, toys, tree holes, plastic covers or tarpaulins and or any other container where mosquitoes can breed.

• Empty and change the water in bird baths, fountains, pet bowls, wading pools, rain barrels, and potted plant trays/saucers at least once a week to destroy potential mosquito habitats.

No Slash or Materials on District Greenbelt or Trails

While conducting fire mitigation, our contractor noticed slash piles and construction materials in district greenbelt. Residents should remove any slash or materials they or a previous owner may have put onto district land. Additionally, residents should not push or deposit needles or other yard waste on any trails or district greenbelt. We have received reports of individuals doing this. Please immediately stop doing so and remove what you have put onto the trails or greenbelt. While those doing this may have good intentions, depositing any materials on the trails is prohibited. It can be a fire danger as well as a hindrance or danger for bikers, etc. Thank you for your cooperation.

The pond is filled for the season. There are dragonflies and blackbirds among other wildlife to check out while sitting on one of the benches or walking by on the paths. The Cutrine treatment is working well on the algae. We will continue to monitor it through the summer.

Bears and Springtime



Bears are back. Trash containers should be inside so the bears do not start frequenting our neighborhood. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at

least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. Residents must leave their trash containers in a garage until the day of pick-up and put the container back inside by the end of the day; or have a bear-proof garbage container.
