

2022 Water Availability

There is water in Lake Durango and our wells are producing a reduced amount of water. So, there is water. However, remember that we are in a prolonged drought so please act and plan accordingly. If you have been thinking about xeriscape, this would be a good time to pull the trigger. In the current climate, lawns and gardens will take a lot more water than usual; and water from Lake Durango is expensive and is not going to get any cheaper. The latest report from the Colorado Climate Center at Colorado State University provides some dire water conditions and projections for the summer.

• We are currently in a severe drought, which may well get worse as the soil moisture from snow melt in the high country dissipates.

• Wildfire potential is above normal and this is projected to continue through June.

• For June through August precipitation is likely to be below normal, temperature is very likely to be above normal.

• Soil moisture conditions are poor, and vegetation across La Plata County is showing long and short-term drought response. The district recommends that all residents conserve water because the projections are for continued drought. And, as always but especially in the current conditions, be fire-wise by not doing any potential fire causing activities.

Road Work June 22-24

Our primary roadwork this year will be Aspen Drive between the first and second stop sign. The extensive milling and overlay project will be a major improvement to this heavily used section of district road and will lengthen the life of the road by 25 years. As



this is a large project, residents on this section of Aspen Drive will need to park elsewhere for a few days. We will provide more specifics regarding parking for residents in this area and traffic flow in a DW2 email.

Our contractor will be doing patching throughout the subdivision as well, so please remember that parking on District streets is prohibited under Resolution 2004-03, as it greatly hinders our maintenance efforts as well as the safety of residents.



Eliminate Mosquito Breeding Grounds

Please do your part in eliminating breeding grounds for mosquitoes by checking for standing water around your homes and getting rid of it. This small effort will help protect yourself, your family and your neighbors from mosquito-borne diseases. Mosquitoes breed in standing water. A couple of times a week you should drain any areas where water sits — including flower pots and bird baths, pet bowls, gutters and construction materials.



Keep Trash Cans Inside – Protect our Bears

There have been reports of trash can raids by bears resluting in trash by the road — often on properties where the trash can was not left out but dragged to by the bear. Residents need to leave your trash containers inside until the morning of trash pick-up day. Don't leave pet food outside and take down regular bird feeders as they don't need the seed this time of year anyway.

It's a good idea to take your hummingbird feeders in at night as well. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. You can report trash can raids by bears to County Dispatch at 385-2900. To report a bear sighting or for more information and resources, visit bearsmartdurango.org.

Greenbelt Use

Time to get out and enjoy the trails. The greenbelt is for all residents to enjoy and use so please be considerate of your neighbors and our neighbors that border the district. If you walk your dogs, it is your responsibility to



clean up after them as well as to keep them on a leash or under control at all times. Also, a reminder to residents that trails are multi-use including hikers and people with strollers, so please be aware and yield to others when riding bikes, especially around blind curves.
