#### Spring Cleaning in Street Gutters – Take 5 Minutes

There are still a lot of needles (and some rocks, muck) in the street gutters. Residents are asked to take just 5 minutes to clean up what is in front of their property and dispose of it properly. This will assist proper drainage as well as prevent damage to the adjoining asphalt. We greatly appreciate all residents who have already cleaned up the street gutter in front of their homes!

#### SLOW DOWN – Create a Safe Neighborhood

With warmer weather - finally, more people are using the trails and walking in the neighborhood. While the speed limit is 25 mph throughout the neighborhood, it is the individual driver's responsibility to drive even more slowly to safely navigate conditions such as weather or curves. It is everyone's responsibility to create a safe neighborhood.



### Bears Return – Keep Trash Cans Inside



Warm weather returning brings the return of our neighbors – bears. Leave your trash containers inside until the morning of trash pick-up

day. It's a good idea to take your bird feeders in at night as well. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. ### Spring Clean-up

Spring is the perfect time to clean up your yard and the areas surrounding your home. Disposing of downed branches, yard slash and pine needles will go a long way to protecting you and your neighbors in the event of a

wildfire. Also if you are cleaning out sheds or other buildings that may have mice droppings or wood piles near your home, take precautions to prevent hantavirus – visit: cdc. gov/rodents/cleaning/index.html. You can also do many things to prevent rodents from inhabiting areas in the first place – visit: cdc.gov/hantavirus/hps/prevention.html

We understand that the hard winter will bring a lot of clean up for residents. The District has received several inquiries regarding assistance for homeowners in cleaning up their yards. For those who remember the mulching event in 2018, it was a one-time event authorized by the board as a jump start for residents to do fire mitigation. This type of service is outside of the usual confines of a Metro District's responsibility and function. Additionally, residents should know that the District is facing several budget challenges this year including unplanned cleanup in district property, snowremoval expenses nearly double what was budgeted for the entirety of 2023, and a 15% rate increase from Lake Durango Water Authority.

Residents are encouraged to work together to share the cost of renting a dumpster or mulcher; or sharing dump fees (now a flat \$75 for up to 1 ton trailer load at Bondad Land-fill).

#### Fire Hydrants – Access

If you have a fire hydrant on your property, please keep it accessible year-round. During spring and summer, remove shrubs, branches, etc that block visual and physical access.

# **Greenbelt Use**



Time to get out and enjoy the trails. The greenbelt is for all residents to enjoy and use so please be considerate of your neighbors and our neighbors that border the district. If you walk your dogs, it is your responsibility to clean up after

them as well as to keep them on a leash or under control at all times. Also, a reminder to residents that trails are multiuse including hikers and people with strollers, so please be aware and yield to others when riding bikes, especially around blind curves.

## **Reminder: AED at Mail Building**

There is an automated external defibrillator (AED) device from Heart Safe La Plata at the DW2 Mail Building. An AED is a portable device that is simple to use.



It checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm.

### What Not to Put Down the Toilet



Everything you put down the toilet ends up at the wastewater treatment plant so **do not flush anything down except human waste and regular toilet paper.** Wet wipes, tampons, dental floss, and even facial tissues create maintenance messes. Even if wet wipes say 'flushable', they should go in the trash. When wet wipes and other items

meet up in the collection system with oil and grease, there's a log jam causing backups or clogs in the collection system. Do not flush cat pee or poop from your kitty litter box down the toilet. Other items not to flush include: Baby Wipes (even those that say they are flushable), Dental Floss, Qtips, Cotton Balls, Diapers, Condoms, Paper Towels, Napkins, Papers, Medication, Cigarettes, Coffee Grounds.

## Be a Good Neighbor - Clean Up after Your Dog



Please be respectful of district property and

residents' yards by always picking poop up after your dog(s) as well as your poop bags when you are on District roads, trails, greenbelts, and residents' yards and disposing of those bags properly. This helps to ensure that everyone can fully enjoy our subdivision and prevents pollution.

#### **Red Flag Warnings and Wildfire Preparation**

Springtime brings beautiful spring flowers and budding trees. It also often signals the start of the red flag warning season. With all the moisture we had this winter, hopefully there will be less Red Flag
